## PREFACE


In the Planned era of Economic Development, Wages play an important role. The variation in the wage rates in different sectors of the economy is mainly due to the difference in the nature of the activity undertaken, the type of skill required etc. For policy formulation, a study of the trend in wage rates over a period of time as well as between different sectors and occupations is highly useful.

This report contains an analysis of the trend in wage rates for different types of labour in the Construction and Trade and Commerce Sectors in Kerala during the period 1974-75 to 1977-78. The data presented in this report are derived from a sample survey on Wage structure in the Construction and Trade and Commerce Sectors conducted by the Bureau of Economics and Statistics on a continuing basis.

This report is prepared in the Labour and Housing Statistics Unit of the Bureau.

## REPORT ON THE WAGE STRUCTURE SURVEY IN KERALA FOR THE PERIOD 1974-75 to 1977-78

### Introduction

Wages play a significant role in an era of planned development. The main object of all economic activities is the satisfaction of human wants and this could be achieved only by assuring a reasonable level of real earnings to the Working class. The Fair Wages Committee set up by the Government of India defined three broad concepts viz., 'The Minimum Wage', 'The Living Wage' and 'The Fair Wage'. The Minimum Wages Act of 1948 was intended to provide the workers with minimum rates of wages. The wage rates in the various sectors of the economy will vary according to the nature of the activity undertaken in each sector, productivity, type of skill etc.

The Wage Structure Survey was started in 1963-64 by the Bureau of Economics and Statistics. The main object of the survey is to study the trend in wage rates for different kinds of skilled and unskilled persons in the 'Construction' and 'Trade and Commerce' Sectors in Kerala over a period of years. This report deals with the wage rates in the 'Construction and Trade and Commerce Sectors' during the years from 1974-75 to 1977-78.

### Sample Design

The survey is being conducted every year in four quarterly rounds on a sample basis. Rural-Urban comparison of wages for different kinds of skilled and unskilled labourers is also made. The survey covers the entire State and a stratified multi-stage random sampling method is adopted for the survey. In the urban sector all the District headquarters are selected. Besides, one more Municipality is selected at random from each District.

From the rural sector three Panchayats are selected randomly from each District. Fresh samples were selected every year from 1963-64 to 1971-72. But later it was decided to retain the same sample list for a period of five years. Hence from 1972-73 to 1976-77 a fresh sample list was prepared. This fixed sample will enable a better comparison of data over a period of years. A fresh list of units was again prepared for the period from 1977-78 to 1981-82. The number of units selected was the same as in the previous years. But in most cases this is not possible in the construction sector. The selection of Municipalities and Panchayats is being done in the Housing Cell in the head office and the lists are sent to the District Statistical Officers. The selection of wards and units are made by the District Statistical Officers. If any selected unit stops functioning it will be substituted by another nearby unit.

**(I) Construction sector:**

In the construction sector all the District headquarters have been selected. Apart from this, one more Municipality is selected by simple random sampling from each District. Five construction units each are selected at random from the district headquarters and Municipalities. In the rural sector three Panchayats had been selected from each district and three units were selected from each Panchayat. Altogether from each district ten units were selected in the urban sector and nine units in the rural sector. The daily wage rates of skilled and unskilled labourers have been collected for each quarter by contacting the contractors, or those who are responsible for the payment of wages. Over-time allowances, if any, are not included in wages.

Skilled labour comprises of Carpenter, Mason, Painter, Sawyer, Plumber, Electrical Wireman etc. Unskilled labour includes male, female and child labour.

The average daily wages (urban) in the construction sector during the decade 1967-68 to 1977-78 (vide Tables Ia and Ib) are furnished in the following tables.

The above data reveal that in the Urban Sector, wages of Unskilled workers increased more rapidly than skilled workers during the decade 1967-68 to 1977-78. During the decade under reference, the wage rate of Carpenter and Mason had gone up by 130% while the increase registered in the case of unskilled labour (both male and female) was more than 150%.

In the urban sector among skilled workers the average annual increase in the wage rates of carpenter during the decade 1967-68 to 1977-78 was 13.1% as against the annual average rate of 12% during the previous decade. Similarly the average annual increase in the wage rates of masons was 13% during the period under report [vide Table 1(a).]

The wage rates of unskilled workers—male, female and children exhibited an annual increase of 15.57%, 15.20% and 11.47%, respectively during the same period [vide Table 1(b)].

During the period from 1970-71 to 1977-78 the average annual increase in the wage rates of painter recorded 11.7% while that of sawyer was 13.6%. Similarly the average annual increase in the wage rates of plumber and electrical wireman were 9.3% and 10.2%, respectively. [vide Table 1(a)].

As in the previous years the wages of both skilled and unskilled workers increased more steeply in the rural sector compared to the urban areas. The increase in wages during the decade was of the order of 144% in the case of carpenter and 137% in the case of mason. The wages of unskilled male and female labourers have also gone up by more than 160%. The average annual increase in the wage rates of skilled labour such as carpenters and masons are worked out as 14.44% and 13.73%, respectively. In this sector during the period from 1970-71 to 1977-78 the average annual increase in the wage rates of painter (I class), sawyer, plumber and electrical wireman were 18.3%, 14.0%, 11.3% and 11.8%, respectively [vide Table (IIa)].

A district-wise analysis reveals that during the decade 1967-68 to 1977-78, the annual average increase in the wage rates of carpenter (I class) has ranged from 12.25% to 16.59% in rural areas as against 9.0% to 15.77% in urban areas. It is evident from Table III (a) that in the Rural Sector, Quilon District recorded the maximum rate of annual average increase in wages. In urban sector, Kozhikode District displayed the same trend. For both Urban and Rural sectors, the average annual increase was minimum in the case of Palghat District [vide Table III(a)].

In the case of Mason I Class, the average annual increase in the wage rates has ranged from 9.87% to 18.99% in rural areas as against 10.24% to 15.59% in urban areas. Table III (b) reveals that Trichur and Cannanore Districts recorded the maximum rate of annual average increase in rural and urban areas respectively. As regards masonry labour, Palghat District exhibited the minimum rate of annual average increase in wages both for rural and urban sectors [vide Table III (b)].

The wage rate of unskilled labour increased at a faster rate than that of skilled labour both in the rural and in urban sectors [vide Table IV (a) and IV(b)]. The annual percentage increase in the wage rates of men is the highest in Quilon for both rural and urban areas. Similarly the wage rates of women (both rural and urban) exhibited the maximum increase in Trivandrum district. The lowest percentage increase in the case of unskilled labour (Men) for rural sector was noticed in Kottayam district, while for urban

areas a similar trend was seen in Trivandrum district. The wage rates for women exhibited the lowest increase in Alleppey district in the case of rural sector while for urban areas the same trend was seen in Kottayam district.

The District-wise average daily wage rates of skilled and unskilled labour during the years 1967-68, 1974-75, 1975-76, 1976-77 and 1977-78 are furnished in Appendix Tables 1.1 to 1.10.

## *II. Trade and Commerce Sector*

As in the construction sector, all the district headquarters and one more Municipality from each district were selected for the survey. From each Municipality/Corporation two wards were selected and from each ward three shops of the categories appended below had been selected for the trade and commerce sector.

1. Foodgrains and provisions	(Wholesale)
2. Textiles	do.
3. Metal and Metal Products	do.
4. Foodgrains and provisions	(Retail)
5. Textile shops	do.
6. Shops dealing with stationery and toilets	do.

The Investigators visit the selected shops every quarter and collect the monthly wages relating to shop assistants and shop attenders from the pay rolls kept by the owners of shops and by oral enquiries. Overtime allowances, if any, were not included in wages.

(a) *Wholesale Trade*.—It is evident from the tables V(a) and V(b) that the average monthly wage rates in the trade and commerce sector have more than doubled during the period under review. In the wholesale trade the maximum increase in the wage rates of both the shop assistants and shop attenders were recorded in Textile shops. It is evident from table V(a) that during the decade from 1967-68 to 1977-78 the wage rates of shop assistants in foodgrains and provisions, cloth, metal and metal products rose by 191%, 197% and 145%, respectively. Similarly, wage rates of shop attenders in foodgrains and provisions, cloth, metal and metal products, have gone up by 149%, 167% and 149%, respectively. This can be gauged from Table V(b).

The district-wise analysis of the wage rates in wholesale shops in Urban areas reveals that the maximum percentage increase in wages for shop assistants was recorded at Trichur for foodgrains and provisions.

The wage rates in textiles and metal and metal products exhibited maximum increase in Ernakulam and Cannanore Districts respectively. [vide Table VI (a)]

As regards shop attenders (Wholesale Trade—Urban) the percentage increase in the wage rates was the highest in Trichur for foodgrains and provisions. Ernakulam and Cannanore displayed the same trend for textiles and metal and metal products respectively. Quilon district recorded the lowest annual average increase in foodgrains and provisions, Palghat district in textiles and Kozhikode district in metal and metal products. [Vide Table VI (b)].

(b) *Retail Trade:* In Retail trade, three types of shops viz., foodgrains and provisions, cloth and stationery have been included. Wage rates in retail shops were found to be lower than those of the wholesale shops.

The average monthly wage rates of shop assistants and shop attenders in retail trade during the decade 1967-68 to 1977-78 are furnished in Tables VII (a) and VII (b).

It is evident from the above tables that the maximum rate of increase in wages of shop assistants was seen in textiles. The same trend for shop attenders was observed in stationery shops.

The percentage average annual increase in wage rates of shop assistants was 19.55 in foodgrains, 22.78 in textiles and 20.21 in stationery. Among shop attenders, the average annual increase was of the order of 18.84 % in foodgrains, 17.65% in textiles and 19.05% in stationery [vide Tables VII (a) and VII (b)].

The district-wise analysis reveals that during the decade 1967-68 to 1977-78, Kottayam district recorded the maximum % increase in wage rates of Shop Assistants in foodgrains and provisions trade. In textiles highest increase was seen in Kozhikode district and in stationery a similar trend was displayed by Trivandrum district [vide Table VIII (a)]. In the case of shop attenders, the highest % increase in wages in foodgrains trade was seen in Trivadrum district. In the case of textiles and stationery, the % increase in wages was the highest in Quilon and Trivandrum respectively. For Shop Assistants the % increase in wages was the lowest in foodgrains trade in Ernakulam district. Similar lowest trends were observed in the case of Textiles and Stationnery trade in Quilon district [vide tables VIII (a) & b)].

The average monthly wage rates of Shop Assistants and Shop Attenders in the various districts of the State during the period 1967-68 to 1977-78 are furnished in appendix 2.1 to 2.10.

### III. Wages and cost of living indices

As we are aware the trend of prices and cost of living have always a notable impact on wages and vice versa. The rise in price of the consumer articles will urge the labourers to demand an increase in the wage rates to adjust themselves to the increase in the cost of living. The consequent rise in wage will cause an inflation again.

On close analysis of all the statements included in this report we can understand that the wage rates have shown a steady increase in all sectors of the economy. Money wages represent the amount of money received by the worker for the work done for a particular period while the real wages refer to the total quantity of goods and services that can be purchased with the money wages. In other words, real wages involve a relationship between money wages and the retail price level or the cost of living.

The trend in wage indices in the Construction and the Trade and Commerce Sectors and the Consumer Price Indices in the 3 important centres of Kerala for the decade 1968-69 to 1977-78 are presented in tables 9, 10 and 11.

It can be seen that the increase in the General Index during the period 1968-69 to 1974-75 was much faster than the increase exhibited by the wage indices in the Construction Sector. This obviously indicates that wage rates of Carpenter, Mason and Unskilled labour did not move as fast as the increase in the cost of living, during these 10 year period. But from 1974-75 onwards the cost of living index showed a downward movement, but the wage indices for all the categories, not only did not fall, but exhibited an upward move. Hence when the position for the decade (1968-69 to 1977-78) as a whole is taken, wages in the Construction Sector (for all categories both rural and urban) increased much faster than the increase in the General Index.

But in the Trade and Commerce Sector, both in the wholesale trade and in the retail trade, increase exhibited by the wage indices up to the period 1974-75 was much faster than the increase seen in the General Index. But the wage indices in the metal and metal products group (Wholesale) was an exception; the increase registered during the period 1968-69 to 1974-75 was far below the increase in the general index. Hence the employees in this trade were affected adversely owing to the increase in the cost of living. The picture is slightly different when the entire period from 1968-69 to 1977-78 is taken. The wage indices of all the categories coming under Trade and Commerce Sector increased more rapidly than the increase in the General Index. It can be concluded that the movement of wage index was not unsavourable to the employees in the Construction and Trade and Commerce Sectors in Kerala.
